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### **Background:** Design Challenge & Problem Statement

The purpose of our research study is to gain an understanding of our users, their needs, how they find information, and what they know about UX. It will guide our future design thinking stages of UX mapping, iteration, prototypes, testing, and designs. We will be using a combination of research methods and collecting qualitative and quantitative data.



Our overall goal is to answer the question, "How might we provide accessible information about UX careers for first-year UX students?"

## **Objectives:**

## Methodology:

Our two research methods include primary and secondary research and data collection. In addition, we will be analyzing existing company/industry reports, journal articles, and competitive products/apps.

**Goal C-** Gain a better understanding of why students are interested in pursuing a UX career

**Goal D-** Learn what information students look for when considering a job/career and their motivation factors

#### **Research Focus:**

In order to conduct our research, we are using a survey (which will be distributed online) and interviews (which are held in-person or arranged to be done virtually).

#### Research Questions Assigned:

- > Who are the users?
- > What do they need to do?
- > Where are they located?
- > What are their challenges and why are they having difficulties?

- ➤ What are their tasks? How do they expect to complete their tasks?
- ➤ How would users expect information (or other necessary stuff) to be organized on the site or in the space?
- ➤ Where would users expect to find X content on the site?

#### **After Interview:**

### **Experiment Questions & Tests:**

#### Usability and Behavior Test:

- Have the participant use/get a device they have access to (mobile phone, laptop, tablet, etc)
- 2. Ask the participant to find a list/information about the job tasks/duties for a "User Experience Researcher"
  - a. Record their actions, challenges, problems, and observations
- 3. Ask the participant to find the average salary in Canada for a "User Experience Researcher"
  - a. Record time on task and satisfaction metrics

### **Knowledge Test:**

- 1. Have participant name/list as many UX careers they can within 30 seconds
  - a. Record the titles/names to find the most popular careers

## **Survey Guide:**

### Introduction

- o Introduce the main overview and objective of the project
- Acknowledge and ensure participants understand that survey is voluntary
- o Discuss what the results and findings will be used for
- Use questions listed in Research Questions

#### Conclude

Provide thanks and appreciation for participating in the survey

### **Interview Guide:**

#### Introduction

- o Introduce all team members
- o Provide a basic outline of the project, objective, and overview
- Introduce purpose and reasoning for data
- Discuss why we need interviews and how their data will be used

#### Interview Questions

- List and explain research questions; listed in the Research Questions section
- Provide sample answers if needed/clarification
- Moderate, take notes and observations

#### Conclude

- Thank interviewees for their time and participation
- Ask any follow-up questions or insights
- Provide details and notice if interested about where results and the final project can be found
